We have been looking up the bond and in a day or two after we get Selden settled I am going to be driven out by a government letter \$ find our bond it will cost about \$25 I am told.

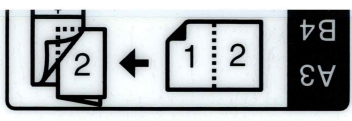
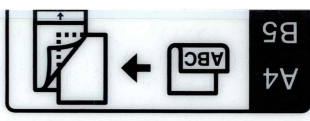
