Dear Mother:-

We have not heard from you for several weeks. Are you too busy to write? I am sure you don't write to us as much as we do to you. We would like to know when you are going to come. A letter came from Evelina last night in which she asked me whether we wanted her to come. It seems to me as tho it is awfully hard to impress you people with the fact that we want you. I do hope you both will come.

They are ballasting the railroad now; trains hauling gravel night & day and Sundays. I think the trains will probably be running by the first of July. The station is to be built at Chinook as soon as the material which is on the way gets here. The stations are finished in most of the other towns.

Monday,

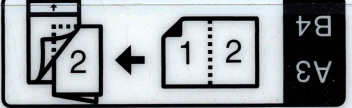

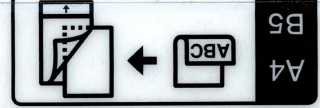
I was over at Oyen the end of last week, but there was not much doing in my line there. I made a couple of hundred post cards & a dozen pig pictures. I will send you some.

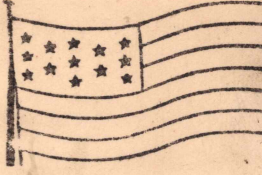

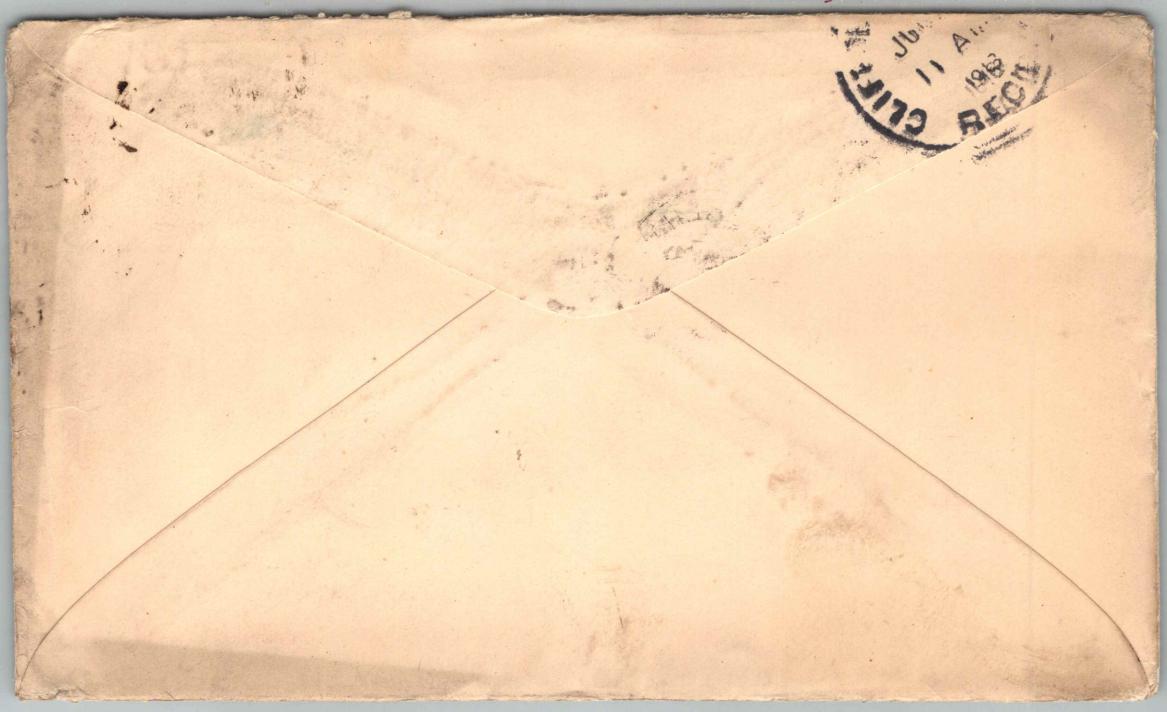
