They are too close together only seven miles apart.

We are having a gasoline plowing outfit back for us now. They have done fifty acres on my place & are going to do about ninety on Will's. Next year we expect to have nearly two hundred & fifty acres in crop. I hope it will be a good year for crops.

My folks are sort of "on the bum". In the sum too I guess. I will have them attended to as soon as I can afford it. A

good dentist is hard to find & it costs a great deal here. I do not have the toothache altho I find it very hard to eat meat. The teeth I should chew meat with have big pieces broken off & the fillings are all gone too. Fortunately meat is not abundant & eggs are. We get about a dozen eggs a day from our hens.

I am glad to hear that your daughter is so good about directions & remembering places. That is a very necessary quality for one to have.
