Dear Mother

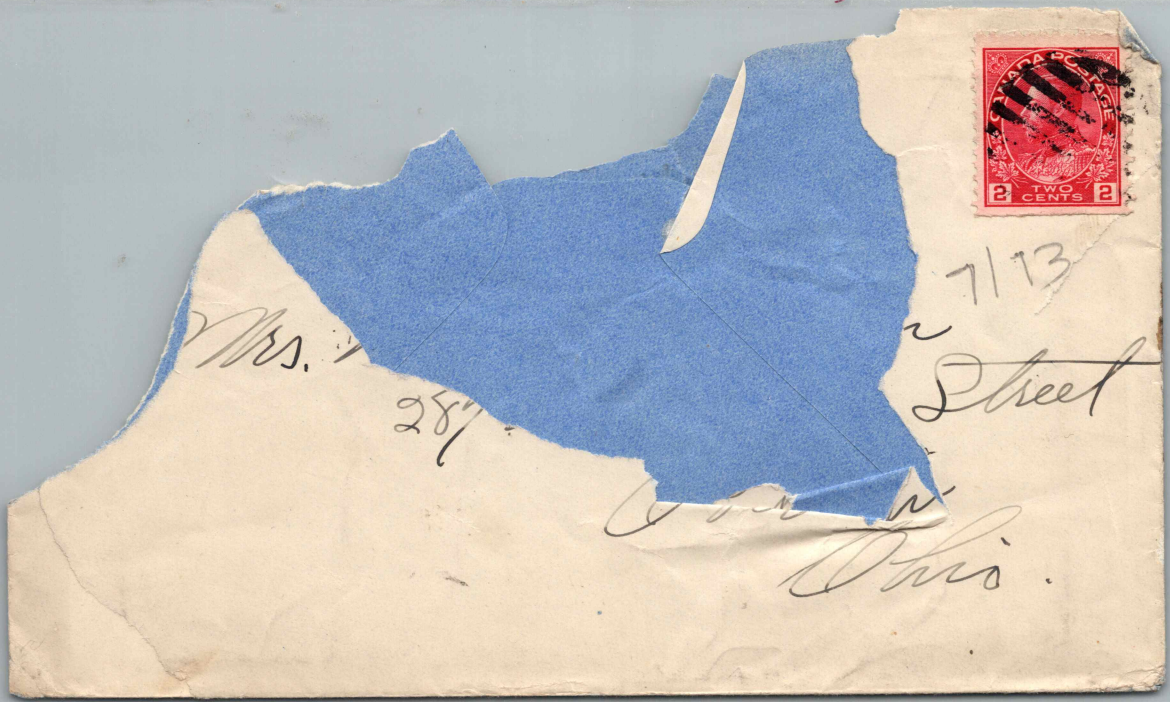

goodbye. Love, Selden.



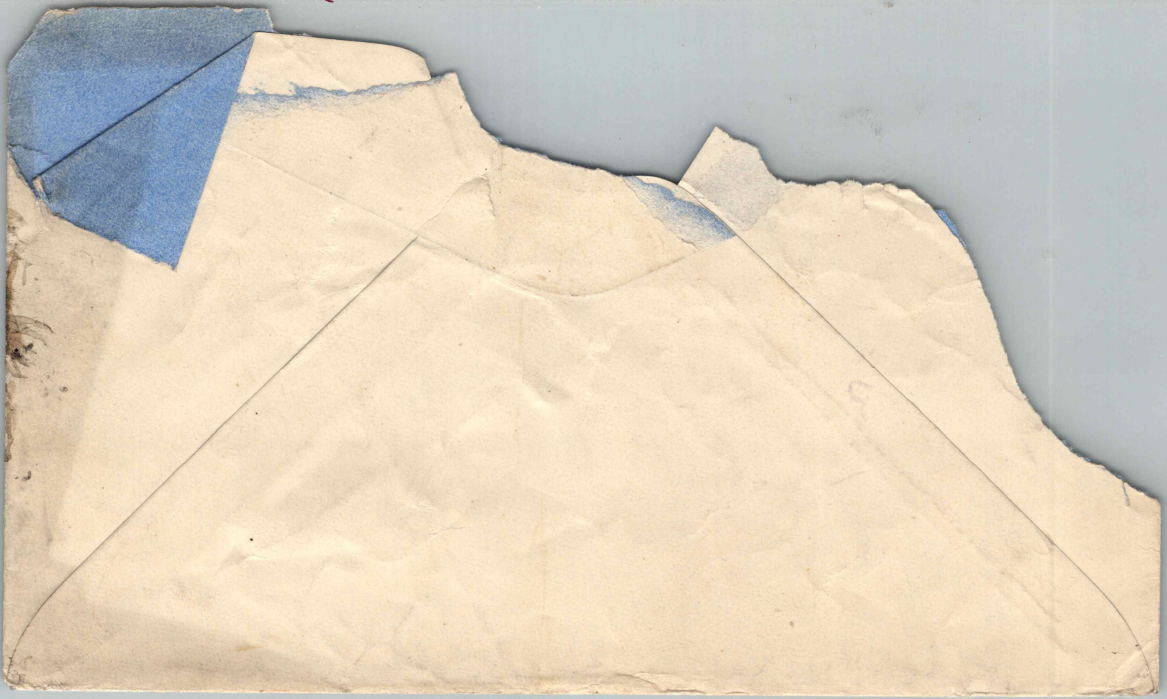

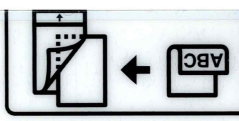

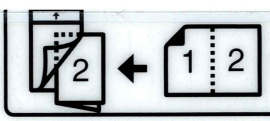
