Dear Momma:-

Your letter reached me O.K. and Tom in Calgary en route to the coast. I can't get a rate and my fare will be \$25.00 from here. I met a woman at the hotel here who is a sister in law of Mr. Prince and an Oberlin graduate her father having been a Baptist minister in Oberlin during Finney's time. I used to know her son in my high school class. Her name is Mrs. Hill. She is selling a fifteen or twenty volume finely illustrated book of travel written by a Mr. Stoddard who she says has lectured at Oberlin. She is giving me a note of introduction to her company's representative in Seattle which I might use if everything else failed. It's a fine book and I'd undertake an agency for it if I had confidence in my ability canvassing but I don't even need your advice to know I'm not very good at that. Mrs. Hill makes over fifty dollars a week she says. Four sales will make that.

I was awfully sorry to hear the sad news about Ellen's baby and I mean to write to her though I don't know very much that I can say.

What did you think of my buying Mr. Bolinger's
Cyuse. I could have bought her for fifty five dollars
with colt at her side but you see she would need
extra care in the winter and the colt should be halter
broken and weaned this winter so that she can be
in good shape before her next colt in ~~the~~ June.

To have her pastured would cost about ten dollars
if no special care is given her. I can buy her without
the colt and have her wintered in good shape and
the colt weaned for forty five dollars. She well broken
coming five years old has been worked two years
and ~~is~~ guaranteed to be in foal by a good stallion
which makes a difference of \$5 or \$10 in her value. I wish I
could sell my white mare but it is the wrong time of year
to sell to advantage. She seems to stay pretty wild
though she behaves well in harness.

Mr. Williams of Toledo has written for me to
Ottawa and recommended that ~~my~~ ^{our} time be extended and
he thinks it will be.
