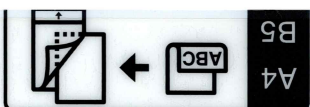
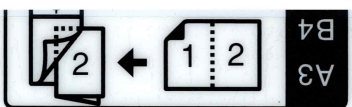
Dear Sir, -

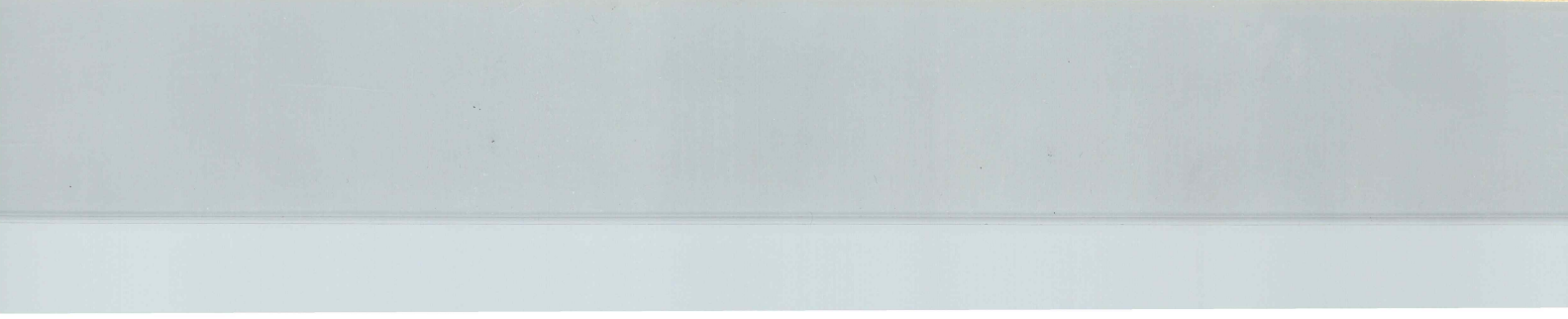

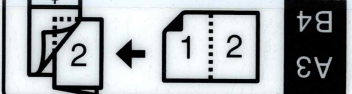

Remember me to all the Dowsley's and tell Moeza I enjoyed her jelly very much.

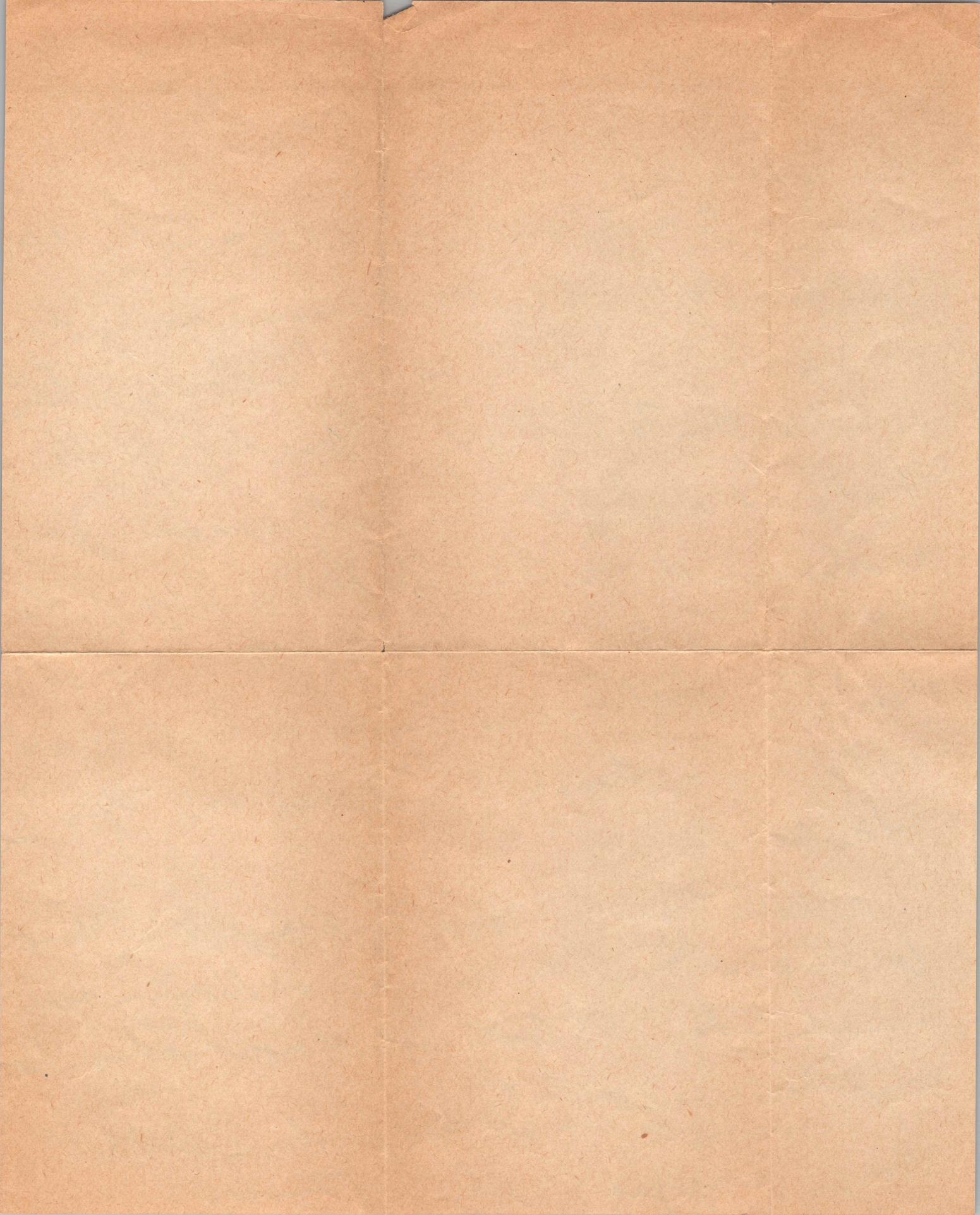

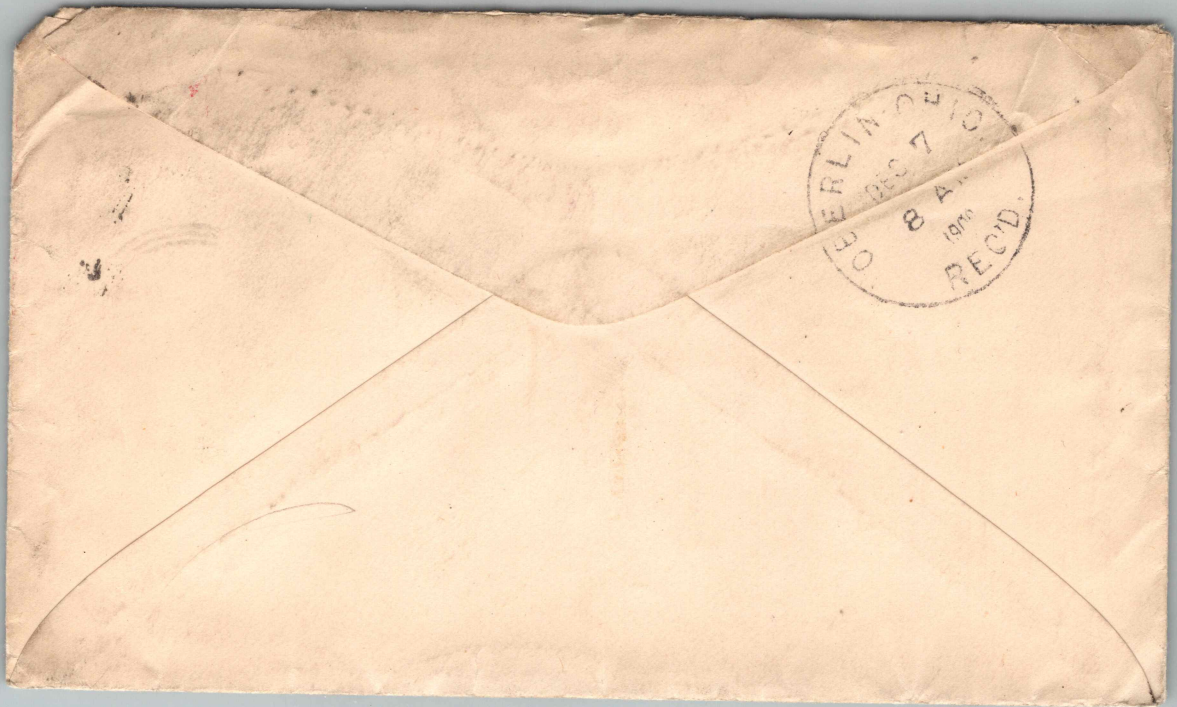
