My dear girls:-

Selden is just going over to the mail, & I must hastily write a line to send with him.

Just as I was finishing up our few dinner dishes &c. a neighbor (one mile distant) came to see me, & it is now half past five. Then people go so far they make visits long enough to make it worth while.

Every thing is going on very comfortably here. It is a busy haying time for the boys. They have about thirty boys

of hay stacked up, & a good
deal more to get in. They
cut the hay off of their lengths,
(also, pronounced, perhaps else)
in a better spelling,
The Runn I made to the home
about Sep. 15, but cannot go
without money as the boys have
none to lend me. In my first
letter I wrote that I had
only about five dollars left, and
as my berth will be free
but ~~at~~ am in a bad fix, I
may not have made it clear
how much I shall need
the money for must stay

there) and it takes forever
to get a letter back & forth
between Shelburne & here. I want
to see you better than
when I was at the other
end of the line - It is like
smoking the ocean or more
& some here.

Welden is hurrying me, so
good bye, I have been
perfectly well & happy all
the time - Much love
Wm. S. Welden

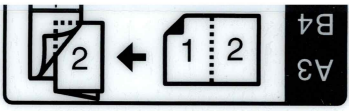

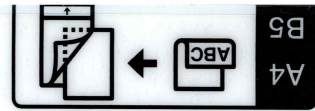
