Dear Selden :-

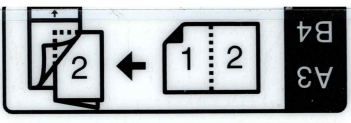
I am sending on a few letters. Please send me the power of attorney unless ~~the banker~~ you have done so. The banker asked me for it again.

It has been very cold & stormy - 40° below or so, but is warming up. It will start this P.M. or tomorrow on the well again. It's about 30 today. (30° below at supper time last night.)

The mails are very irregular. I have had only one S. & E. Post this year I think - possibly two - no American magazines. Letters come late etc.

Had a letter from Mr. Willis again & he wants \$500, will wait for the rest. I think I'll try to borrow \$1000 + int & exchange (20 or so to get back two \$500 notes) as soon as I get your power of attorney. I'll give the agreement of sale as security with the understanding that this \$1000 shall be repaid only out of the Peyton fork. Any objections. I'll do this as soon as I get your power of attorney.

Horses are doing fairly well but the crust is very bad. I may haul some wheat straw for them. Had Queenie & Jerry shod in front old shoes - very slippery. Will,
