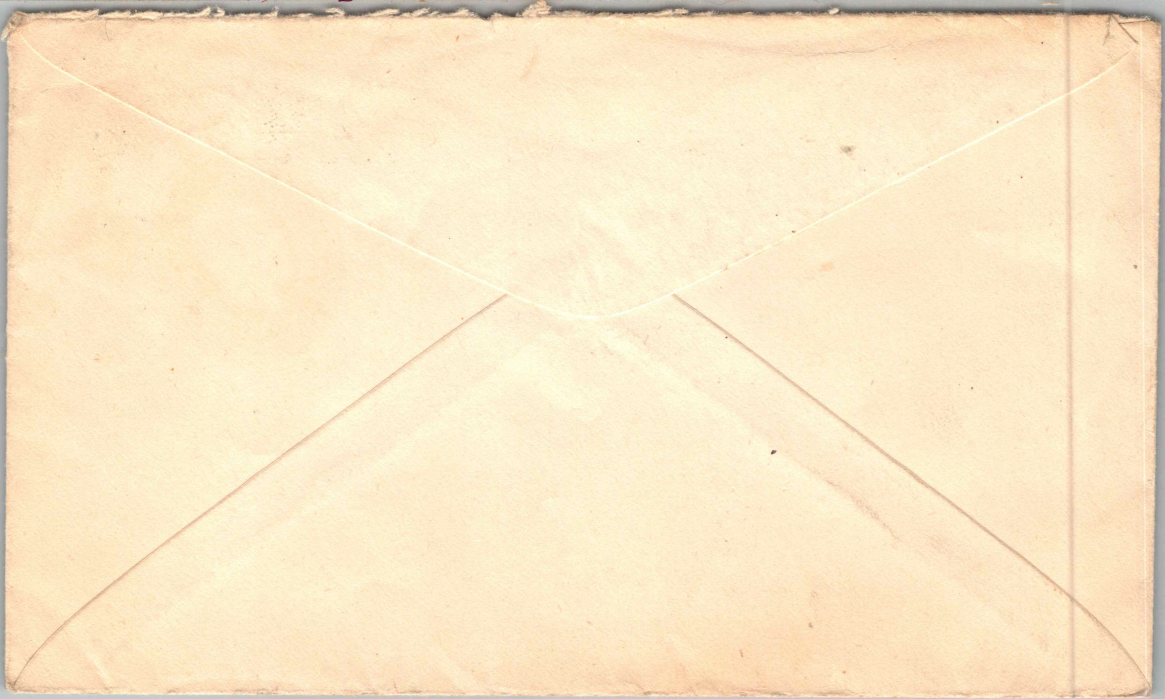
The roads were too bad for anyone to bring

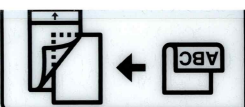

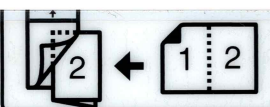
