Calvinistic system as set
forth in the Confession.

As to the second question.

The Comm. report that in

their judgement it is desirable
Changes sh^d be made in
those part of the Confession
that relate to Preterition &
Reprobation, to Elect Infants
& those who have not heard
or are unable to under-
stand the Gospel.

They also suggest the propriety
of making prominent in the
Confession a full and

definite statement of the
love of God to all men
& of the free offer of the
Gospel to all - and
further a careful
revision of the proof texts.
The Comm. do not deem
it their duty, however, to
formulate these changes.
