-tarium.

I understand there are  
two, perhaps more, rooms  
enclosed, which Miss  
Potter & Miss Brewster had  
a year ago at \$10 a week.

Can a man get into  
any such rooms?

As you are on the ground it  
seems that you can get  
more exact information  
than I could by writing to  
any one except Mr Foster.

If he cannot go there,  
or if we cannot send him,  
there is no use in telling  
who he is, and of course  
publicly hunt.

Will you kindly, & as  
quickly as possible get the  
bottom facts & report.
