I received your

Bridgeton - May 25th 1887 - You
say I was sorry not to see
you at the C. S. M. meeting - I was
not aware of such a meeting
invitation. I have ^{had} some corres-
pondence with Bro: Donald
McLaren, and at his ^{request}
have written to fine papers
on the C. S. M. - If they

are published and sent
to me I will as requested
send them to you. I can
say that I had not at
my command a number
of the papers you referred
to but I did as well as
I could. You say, Our English
brethren made great account
in the success of the F. S. M. to
the fact that the speaking was
neither in a jocular nor a
legging vein, but in the Spirit:
"I have a message from God
unto thee" I married a young
woman, and we went to

the Gaboon River, ^{West Africa} and
she died there after a
year and two months with
her babe - quite a number
of missionaries have died
at that place, and really
in view of these deaths -
it seems to me they would
not have a jocular vein
but call to us from their
sufferings for the Master
to be as solemn as death
and dreadful as eternity.
