MISSIONARY MEETINGS.

The Presbytery of Newton having, at the request of its Women's Society, authorized a special missionary meeting in each of its churches during the winter, the following schedule has been arranged, with the understanding that the pastors of each group are a committee (the first named being the responsible Chairman) to fix dates and make local arrangements.  - V. Newton, Sparta and Ogdensburg, Branchville, Lafayette.
 - VI. Deckertown, Wantage I., Wantage II., N. Hardyston.
 - VII. Stillwater, Marksboro, Blairstown, Yellow Frame.
 - VIII. Stanhope, Hackettstown, Beattystown, Mansfield II.

The Committees of Home and Foreign Missions will gladly render any possible assistance in the conduct of these meetings; it is suggested that the groups may be able to secure missionaries or others who will contribute to the interest and success of the effort. The Societies of Women are especially requested to cooperate with this movement, and the Chairmen of the several groups are asked to report, when the meetings have been held, to the Chairman of Committee Foreign Missions,
