Dr. Dixie spoke admirably upon our
first meeting the way in which the
whole Church is held responsible for a spe-
cific case where a large sum of money
was defrauded her come up to its duty. He

air with enthusiasm. Encouraged our
feelings in reporting the next day, and
answering you promptly, and concisely,
and methodical effort. I am not
just sure about the make up of the finan-
cial Com. - not sure whether I am at-
tached, any way. I shall work for the cause
as I see it. I hope you are fortifying
yourself P. F. Lawrence.
