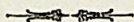

L. Search the Scriptures, for in them ye think ye have eternal life, and they are they which testify of me. John 5: 39.

S. And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shall talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up. Deut. 6: 7.

L. Come, ye children, hearken unto me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord. Ps. 34: 11.

S. The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; but fools despise wisdom and instruction. Prov. 1: 7.

L. My son, hear the instruction of thy father, and forsake not the law of thy mother. Prov. 1

S. My son, if sinners entice thee, consent thou not. Prov. 1: 10.

L. Thou, Lord, hast not forsaken them that seek thee. Ps. 9: 10.

S. And thou, Solomon my son, know thou the God of thy father, and serve him with a perfect heart and with a willing mind; for the Lord searcheth all hearts, and understandeth all the imaginations of the thoughts: if thou seek Him, He will be found of thee; but if thou forsake Him, He will cast thee off forever. 1 Chron. 28: 9.

L. Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. Eph. 6: 1.

S. Honor thy father and thy mother; that thy days may be long upon the land which the Lord thy God giveth thee. Ex. 20: 12.

L. I love them that love me, and those that seek me early shall find me. Prov. 8: 17.

S. Remember now thy Creator in the days of thy youth, while the evil days come not, nor the years draw nigh when thou shalt say, I have no pleasure in them. Ec. 12: 1.

L. By humility and the fear of the Lord are riches and honor and life. Prov. 22: 4.

S. If any man serve me, let him follow me; and where I am, there shall also my servant be; if any man serve me, him will my father honor. John 12: 26.

L. There is no want to them that fear Him. Ps. 34: 9.

S. Seek ye first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things shall be added unto you. Matt. 6: 33.

L. A good man obtaineth favor of the Lord. Prov. 12: 2.

S. Godliness is profitable unto all things; having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come. 1 Tim. 4: 8.

L. But Godliness with contentment is great gain. 1 Tim. 6: 6.

S. The Lord God is a sun and shield; the Lord will give grace and glory; no good thing will He withhold from them that walk uprightly. Ps. 84: 11.

L. Lord, God, what wilt Thou give me? Gen. 15: 2.

S. Be thou faithful unto death and I will give thee a crown of life. Rev. 2: 10.

L. Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Rom. 8: 38.

S. I am persuaded that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord. Rom. 8: 39.
