Rev. W. Park died in Pittsfield Mass Sunday Nov. 24

His associates in ^{the} India Mission which he joined in 1870 say of him "For ten and a half years he labored with great earnestness and devotion. He was an impressive preacher, and in lectures to English speaking natives, few missionaries in his Presidency have equalled him. But he excelled in literary work. For a time he was Secretary of the Bombay Tract Society. For seven years he edited the Dnyanodaya, and he became well known as the originator and editor of The Indian Evangelical Review."

He labored with great energy, often going far beyond his strength, and this so affected his health that early in 1881, he returned to America for rest. He had many friends, both among the Europeans and natives of Bombay, and those most intimately associated with him, cherish his memory with sincere respect and affection. 27
