but do not see very well how I can, as I am very shy of leaving the office at present unless I feel more secure in my position and I presume that it would cut into the day pretty well before I could get back here. My wife is better than she was when you were here but is not yet in visiting trim so that she did not <sup>even</sup> feel equal to going up to Lake Hopatcong for a few days with the boys who are spending the week there.
