

Died-Thursday evening, November 17th, Rev. E. B. Fairfield, D.D., at the age of eighty-three. In the death of Dr. Fairfield Oberlin mourns one of her most beloved and revered citizens, and Oberlin College loses one of her most distinguished alumni. The career of Dr. Fairfield as clergyman, educator and public man was notable. For twenty-one years he was president of Hillsdale College, and for eight years chancellor of the University of Nebraska. He was pastor of the First Congregational Church at Mansfield, O., for nine years, and, for seven years, of the Congregational Church in Manistee, Mich, During his residence at Hillsdale, he served for a term in the state

senate of Michigan, and later he was appointed U. S. consul at Lyons, France, which position he occupied for several years. During the past four years Dr. Fairfield has resided in Oberlin. Funeral services will be held in this house this afternoon at 2:30 o'clock.

In order to the efficient prosecution of their work, the Associated Charities of Oberlin are in need of additional funds.
