My dearest Penncorcks:-

Your letter came

by this morning's mail, and I hasten
to reply before dinner that you may have
the earliest possible answer. I think
your course with Miss D.V. was right
and your decision to stay, right, espe-
cially as she made you feel that you
are really wanted and that she depends
on you. No word of any kind has come
from Cousin Anna's Estate, except a
letter from another lawyer saying that

is ready to reap the benefits. We paid
no attention to the letter. I don't think

will be best all around. You could - for example - go to Kentucky, Miss Welsh would be glad to see you at Berea, that however, would not suit Miss B. (I forgot for the moment) or Cumberland Gap, where Miss Riggs is, or lots of other places. But get a change some how. How many days do you have? Would it pay to come home, or will Miss B. come if you do? Or what plan suits you best? It isn't long till June anyway - only I sort of took it for granted you were coming home this year, and had it really that of an excursion somewhere. What do you think about it all?
