14.A. Your lines are a little weak in places and should have, a little smoothertone and should be more parallel. B. Wery well handled

15.A. Make some of your lines a little emavior; other wise fair. B. The back window should all be in shade; use a little smoother tone in some places as on the back of the church and the tower. C. The tone a little too rough; other wise fair.

1 6. Too even a tone; work dark patches of colfor into the grass, and the barrel to the left should be more in the shade. Some of your lines a little weak and pale.

Extra. L. Make firm heavy out lines for the leaves and your work will not look quite so scratchy.

- 2. The ink on the house is pale; the veranda of the house ashould be horizontal. Foliage is very good in tone and contrast but you should use somewhat heavier lines and be careful of your cross hatch.
 - 3. Is very good. and we will keep it to make use of it
