I also told him that bhe system seemed to me very extravagant of time and energy as Miss Van Wie and I practically duplicate all the He said he thought the whole system probatly ought to be work. changed now that the college had grown to iss present size and asked me if I had ever spoken with the Dean atjut it. I saud I had not and that I would rather keep on doing the work than seem bo criticise her - that I did it as an accommodation to her and was willing to keep on doing it for that reason, even though to me it seems to me an extravagant method. I said that at the time I was a student at Oberlin the college there had about the same number of girls in the college department as we have here and we had an assistant dean and a dean of the college, to say nothingof the men's part - that the dean of women had none of the duties that Dr. Harris has forthe col lede in general. He said he didn't see that this place needed an assistant dean. However, he did say and said it more thanonce - that he thought the Dean here would have to take more of thissort of work on herself and that would mean that she would have to drop more of her teaching. I hope I haven't started simething that will make trouble for Dr. Harris. He said on the xybject of offices that there were to be soem offices gigged up in the basement. this would be practically no use to me as I could not sit there all day and Ineed my office if I have one adjoining my room on account of the fact

these matters have to be attended tozat all kinds of times. He thought that was not necessary, but that is because he has not tried doing it and doesn't visualize the situation. I did not argue with him as I seem to imply. And I did not press the matter of that room. Well that is out of the questio, being able to get the room for nothing - though I think it would be right and fair for me to have it so - I now want to see if \$\overline{D}\$ can get the chance to rent it - which is diso a question as the college is growded and they do not ordinarily rent rooms in a dormitory for people who are not students. I did not say anything on this subject to Dr. Lent last night because I thought it might seem funny right after asking him to give it to me in the other way. I have a notion now to tell the Dean that I want to rent it so that I can have you in ut and see if she will try to get it for me. She wants me to have you here - told me so so that I would feel more settled. I just have a notion that if you were here Dr. Lent might be moved to favor it - he is so moved by his feelings to do things for people in need - I mean if he dets inter ested in them. This is a main reason why I wish you could come after a while before those rooms are disposed of to students. I think the students' rooms are selected on May some time. think about this. I believe that at would be cheaper for us to rent that room and both of us board here next year than to take anything we could get outside the college and perhaps be nicer certainly easier. Then you would not feel committed to Elmira for the whole time and could come and go. Of course, the room would have to be paid for all the time, but the board, whichis more of an item - would not.

My two packages have arrived. I hope ot was Nathalie who took them down. Thank you for the trouble. I wrote to Grace,

I have six of my twelve chairmen now, have written a lot of campaign letters since I came back - about eight yesterday and ten the day before.

Elmira College is having a contest in the city daily about the value of the college to the city - part of the campaign propaganda - and of course, Dr. Geegg and I get the papers to judge - don't you ever think Dr. Smyth would have any of these nasty little jobs to do - she would beg off if sac was asked. There's nothing in the world I HATE so as to judge on contests and there are a lot of papers. Isn't it the limit with all I have to do? The papers areon my table now. I had better get my map over and get to work on them.

I think the girls would be interested in the matter of the room I asked for and so will you please send this letter on to one of them asking her to send it on to theother?
