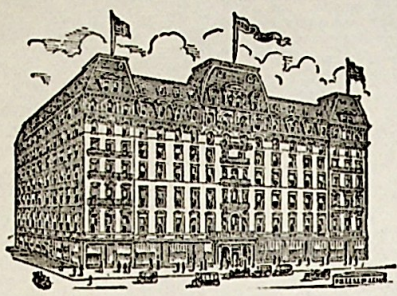

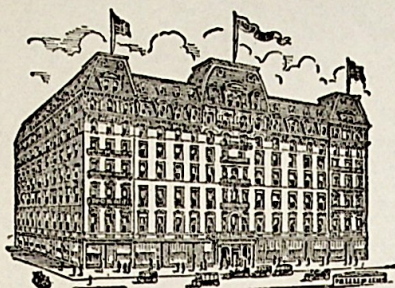

them if she does.

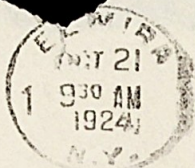
