Dearest Mamma & Gertrude

I want to tell you both
all about our lovely visit & trip.
To go back a little. The Booths
came to call Thurs. eve. They
said Isabel was going out to
Steelton on Friday as Mervin
couldn't come home for the
week end. So George called
up Friday a.m. & Isabel
went by train to Padi where
she joined us. Before the Booths
left Mr. & Mrs. Crist of the

May 2 you school at
Swarthmore came & they
were here until 10 P.M. We
talked over with them a date
for them to come to dinner &
finally settled on June 6th
Decided up by Tuttle & Co. &
& fortunately it suits them to
come that day, for I want
them at the same time.

The children had very
carefully fixed two boxes
for the Cat, one outdoors &
the other in the cellar. But
when we came home Capt.
Brantigan told George that

the Netties had been born in his
mother's bill & he had put the letter to
publish them so they were there until
George put them in the box this m.

There are four Netties & M. E. no
doubt perfectly delightful. George wants to

Now to go back to our trip.
We left here at 12 o'clock on

Friday, picked Isabelle up at Park
and had lunch at our
favorite Inn at Coatsville.
We got to Steelton about 5. We
found Newlin & after a short
wait took him & Isabelle to the
boarding house. Then we
went on & got to the Wilwans
at 5:45 P.M. I got dressed &
we had a nice dinner. In the
eve. Mr. Hallomer & his
sister, Mrs. Graybill (who
lives with him) called. Later
we had a nice call from
Lieutenant Danforth of the
Navy Dept. stationed at H'burg.

By the way, last week when we were in ~~town~~ we saw on the street, our Mr. Franklin, Mamma. I was so glad to see him & he seemed pleased to see us again.

Sat. a.m. we went to the Capitol. I stayed there with the children, while George took Clara to market. ~~and~~ at the Capitol later we met Soabell who came to see the sights. About 11 a.m. George, Clara & Billy came in the Wallover car & we

all went to ~~the~~ ~~store~~. we could travel & go to, but she could not. we went first to our storage - but we could not go with us. We never see Danna later on the Friday & then we had a very good period lunch. It was very good before we left ~~the~~ ~~store~~ & on the way home we had a shower. After cleaning up the children we saw Charles & Mamma & the children in the next in our car & the hallways of the Chamber Club. This is a new building & is very fine, but the situation is

Magnificent! It is on high
ground & the view of the
river & the mountains is
perfectly wonderful. Mr.
Walloway got ginger all
for us & I drank my share!
Jarot here let me tell you the
sequel to the pigeon pie
story! Sat. a.m. for breakfast
the children were served with
soft boiled eggs & I held my
breath to see the result, M.E.
didn't touch hers, but Boy
ate every bit, very slowly!
without any remarks!!

The two little children never
 eat with the family. They
 eat in the kitchen always.

Sat. night we all went
 to the "movies" including
 Horat. W. E. & Bay also
 Mr. Wallower & his sister.
 We asked Newlin & Isabel
 to join us but they couldn't.
 After the show I thought we
 were hurrying home to get
 the children in bed, when we
 stopped at Mr. W.'s invitation
 for hot ice cream!

Sunday a m. Harriet &
M.E. went to S.S. we joined
them at Church. after sun.
dinner we all went over to
the lovely Wallner home.
We were expecting N. & J
so when they came Brad &
George went over & brought
them to the Wallner's for
a little call. When we went
back to Clara's they soon
left & we began to pack. We
left Harrisburg at 3:40 & all
went well until just as we
were going into Lancaster &
there we had a blow-out!

We reached Catonsville at 7 pm. where
we ate supper. Todd was going to stay
until 10:30 a.m. George was rather glad
for he didn't want to put us out in the
park any more about at night with
you out early, wonder if we want to
you leave to Pennsylvania. We got
down at 9:45 & I washed the children
to bed. I fixed ourselves, having made
the bedtime just & we got to bed about 11
we had a perfectly lovely visit. Clara
sent her love to you & Edmund.
