many cumbersome and some
- what expensive devices
have been used but I
think you will find
this simple device to work
admirably it does with
me The brass pulley
lotted to the lower track
is to remain so; the
upper track rests on the
top of it now by putting
a bit of wood on top of
this post between it and
the track you raise the
upper track until the
lantern registers on high
now bore a hole through
the stick so the brass

screw bolt will pass through
and now you can push
the upper track to the right
or left and make them
register together then screw
fast and they are kept
secure in that position

You will find in
one lantern the coupling
I have had made for
you I guess it will
never give out in the
other two colored ones
you ordered they cost 3.00
and the coupling the same

The work on the Stereoph-
-trem cost 3.00
eleven in all

I trust you will
do well with the instrument
the writer of an offering

my services to the School
Commission by one of
their lectures this winter
and in the County where

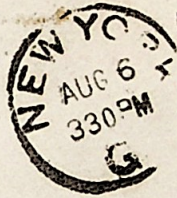
