DEAR DOCTOR:

The frequent inquiries of physicians, regarding the facilities and methods which are employed in caring for, and treating, the sick at the Clifton Springs Sanitarium have led the Medical Staff to draft a circular letter of information which is intended to meet the majority of questions asked.

1. We consider advertising to be out of keeping with the dignity and practice of the profession to which we belong, and with which we labor in perfect affiliation, and, therefore, can not refer you to any advertising columns in medical, or other journals.

2. The Sanitarium is not for the treatment of contagious diseases, nor for insane or incurable cases; neither is it a pleasure resort or summer hotel, but a place where the sick and weary may find appropriate treatment, under a daily regime suitable for each patient.

3. The Medical Staff is composed of eight physicians, six men and two women, all graduates of regular Medical Colleges and members of the various medical societies and associations to which physicians are eligible.

4. The accompanying Bath Ticket contains a list of the more common methods of treatment. For any special conditions, not met by this list, suitable treatments are furnished.

5. The growth of the institution has necessitated the establishment of the following separate departments: Eye, Ear, Nose and Throat, Gynaecological, and Laboratory of Physiological Chemistry and Pathology, all of which are under the care of physicians specially equipped for such work. There is also a well arranged training-school for nurses, a special diet kitchen, and a dispensary under the charge of a licensed pharmacist.

6. When physicians send patients here they are still considered their patients, and as we desire the most cordial co-operation with physicians, any history of, or suggestion concerning, the patient sent, will be fully appreciated.

We heartily invite you to come as our guest at any time, to inspect the Sanitarium, its methods and equipment; or should you wish to send any member of your family here for rest or treatment, a liberal discount from our regular rates will be granted.
