Dear Will

Just as I was leaving
the house this morning a letter for
you was put in my hand & I
put it in my pocket. I went to
various places during the day & did
not think to open it until this
P.M. in Brooklyn. I then found that
it was from Lyman B Goff of
Fawcett & that they want you
there for Sunday the 19th & wanted
an answer right away. I sent
you a despatch from down town on
my way back ~~to~~ from Brooklyn
& also a postal card but as I
changed my coat just before going
I did not have your address & had
to trust to memory & sent Co of
Main & High Street. After I reached

home I found the address was High
near Main & fearing that you
might not receive the despatch I
thought best to write Mr Goff
