Dear Sir:-

Your 28th inst. rec'd. In your former letter you wrote that you desired 2 reams 16x11 cut in four pieces (which would make each piece $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8$) and wished samples sent with price per ream and per pound. As you desired price per pound and our samples were more than double the size you referred to we stated that only 1 ream would be required of the first three samples to make 3840 pieces $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8$ - $3\frac{1}{2}$ reams only of sample D.

Sample A - 20 lb @ 30¢ per lb would be \$6.00 per ream

" B - 20 " @ 20¢ " " " \$4.00 " "

" C - 24 " @ 22 " " " \$5.28 " "

" D - 55 " @ .09 " " " \$4.95 " "

As we stated before 2 reams 16x11 cut in 4 pieces would make 3840 pieces $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8$, 1 ream of samples A B or C - cut in 8 pieces would make 3840 pieces $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8$ $\frac{1}{2}$ ream

of sample D-cut in 16 pieces would
also make 3840 pieces $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8$.

The printing alone of 3840 pieces
 $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8$ would cost \$5.50. The printing
alone of 1920 pieces $5\frac{1}{2} \times 8$ would cost
\$3.50.

Do we understand that we are
to go on and print the ⁵⁰⁰Note Heads
of which you returned ^{and of same paper as before} proof with your
former note? You then ordered us
to hold the proof until price had been
given for the paper noted above and
we did not know but all were to
be printed on same paper.

Your former notes both in regard
to paper and Note Head proof were
a little indefinite. We trust above will
make the matter plain. Please give
us exact order for above and we will
forward the work without delay.
