There are four children, ranging in age from 13 to 4 years. The woman left over a week ago, taking the two older children with her. Mr. Brushaber says she wishes to be separated from him. The family are not immigrants. We refer them to you, hoping you will investigate the state of affairs, especially with regard to the children. If the woman can be found and persuaded to come back, perhaps one of your officers on the case may be able to brace her up. If not, we may be able to assist you in finding a house-keeper for the family that remains.
