So will go ~~to~~ to Westfield and

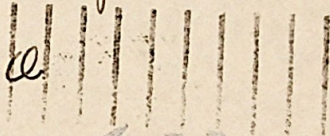
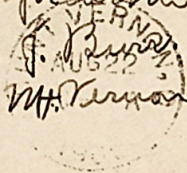
send down those things you
