Question

RESOLVED: That the Government of the United States should aid in building up the American Merchant Marine, by granting subsidies to ships sailing under the American flag and engaged in foreign commerce.

LIMITATIONS—First: The word subsidy shall be construed to include payment for service rendered when the principal object of such payment is to further the purpose of the question as stated.

Second: Subsidies to be granted only for such time, to such ships, and under such conditions as shall further the purpose of granting them.

Third: The constitionality of granting such subsidies is assumed.
