I have registered for my work and am <sup>starting</sup> the first week of the second semester. My courses will be the same as they were last semester. In addition I will be taking a course in municipal government and one in labor problems. I have a place where I wait <sup>(at noon)</sup> table for my dinner.

How <sup>are</sup> you people getting along at home? Are you feeling much stronger yet, and do you have much to worry you? I would like to know what studies Coelina and Selden are taking.

Mr. Hillis is still out here in Vancouver B.C. with the boys. They are very enthusiastic over the possibilities and think they will make their fortunes of there.

I don't believe that I will write much of a letter just now as I have in the process of composition one to Selden. I just wanted to get word to you though that I was registered all right and had a place to work for my dinner. Goodbye Willis
