ENLARGEMENT OF THE CHURCH MISSIONARY GLEANER.

THE CHURCH MISSIONARY GLEANER for JANUARY, 1888, will appear in an altered form. As at present published it consists of sixteen pages, twelve being occupied by Letter-press and Pictures, the other four forming the Wrapper and being filled with Advertisements. In its new form all the sixteen pages will be devoted to Letter-press and Pictures, the Wrapper being printed separately on Tinted Paper similar to this Specimen.

This arrangement will have several advantages; two may be mentioned:—

- (a) Four extra pages, or eight columns, will be set free for Missionary and General Information, besides Pictures, now crowded out.
- (b) It will admit of larger type being used where small type is used now.

Both of these will be important gains.

Several new features for 1888 are being considered, which will, it is hoped, render the GLEANER increasingly acceptable and helpful to all workers for or in the Missionary Vineyard.

The enlargement will largely increase the cost of publication, but the price of the GLEANER will remain the same—One Penny a month. Friends are asked to put forth their best efforts to increase the circulation of the GLEANER by pushing its sale wherever they may have opportunity.

NOTICE TO LOCALISERS.

NEW ARRANGEMENTS.

Hitherto the CHURCH MISSIONARY GLEANER has consisted of a sheet of sixteen pages, the outside four forming the cover, which was available for Local Matter, either one, three, or four blank pages, at the discretion of the Localiser.

From January, 1888, all the sixteen pages will be devoted to Letterpress and Pictures. But in addition there will be a cover, printed separately on tinted paper, similar to this Specimen, which, where required, will be issued to Localisers for their Local Matter without extra charge; or they may have the sheet of sixteen pages, forming the magazine, by itself, leaving their Local Printer to supply the paper for the Local Matter.

DIRECTIONS TO LOCALISERS.

1. Send your order to Messrs. JAS. TRUSCOTT & SON, Suffolk Lane, London, E.C., remitting the price of the copies ordered at the rate of 9d. per dozen or 6s. per hundred, with 2d. for booking, if required.
2. State distinctly whether you require—
 - (a) The GLEANER sheet of sixteen pages *without* the tinted cover.
 - (b) The GLEANER sheet of sixteen pages *with* the tinted cover, all four pages blank.
 - (c) The GLEANER sheet of sixteen pages *with* the tinted cover, three pages blank.
3. In the case of (b) a cast of the picture title, to be used in the local printing, can be had if required. In this cast the space for Contents and spaces across the bottom and the top are left blank. The cost of this cast is 5s.; but Localisers paying in advance for not less than 500 copies for three months can receive it gratis.
4. In the case of (c), the front page of the cover will have on it the picture title as in the complete copies, but with a space at the top left blank for the name of the District or Parish.
5. Send all instructions to Messrs. JAS. TRUSCOTT & SON, as early in the preceding month as possible. Orders received by them prior to the 15th will be executed with the first delivery, which is on or about the 23rd. Orders received after the 15th may have to wait execution till after the copies for general circulation are printed, in which case Localisers can scarcely have their Localised Magazine ready by the last day of the month.
6. Hand your copies, when received, to your local printer, together with the pink cover and MS. of the local matter to be added. He will print the local matter upon the pink cover, and afterwards stitch the whole together for delivery.

N.B.—Messrs. TRUSCOTT are prepared to undertake the printing of the local matter if desired, though, in most cases, an arrangement with a local printer will probably be found more convenient.
