Wm & Ellie

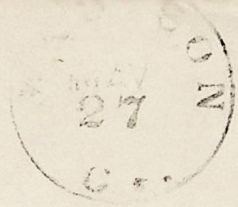
I am in receipt

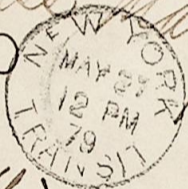
