This book has been prepared at the suggestion and repeated request of many alumni of Lafayette College, who desired some permanent and convenient record of the friends of their college days. It contains brief biographical sketches, with title and present address, not only of all the graduates, but also of their classmates who left college before graduation; this feature adds greatly to its completeness and interest.

It has been no part of the plan to make it a volume of eulogy, knowing that the simple record of facts could not fail to be far more acceptable to those whose names are therein contained, than any efforts at praise, however considerately bestowed or judiciously distributed.

Feeling confident that the men of Lafayette are content that their actions shall speak for them, this book aims only at gathering those items of personal history that belong to the public, and which all readers can peruse with satisfaction.

The serviceableness of the work has been provided for by copious Indexes, and numerous Statistical Tables.

The entire number of students matriculated at Lafayette College is 2400, of whom 272 are now in attendance. Of the graduates, 698 are

Of the entire number here educated 429 are Lawyers, 361 Ministers of the Gospel, 261 Physicians, 140 Professors and Teachers, 31 Editors, 127 Civil or Mining Engineers, 67 Officers of Railroads or in the United States Army, 33 Bank Officers, 72 Farmers, and 317 are Manufacturers or Merchants. 67 are named as early Dead, and the occupations of 225 of the Former Students are unknown.

Public office, Legislative, Executive or Judicial, has been held by 187, 16 have been Presidents of Colleges, or Professors in Theological or Medical Schools, 22 have been Foreign missionaries, of whom four have translated the Bible into other tongues. Forty are recorded as Authors. In the Military Service of their Country 230 have been engaged. The roll of Deceased numbers 369.
