I am sending class letter and also some photos to you in this mail. I didn't pay for the class letter, but they sent me one.

We are putting in the third or last year now on the homestead. Selden will have his time in by last of September but can not get patent till six months later. My time will be up about the same time. It will take three years more to prove up preimptions. Our time doesn't bother us so much as getting out of debt and on to a paying basis. We will have to have \$300 houses on each homestead before we can prove up so likely won't prove up this year.

The railway grading are now in sight of us, and the steel is laid within seventeen miles.

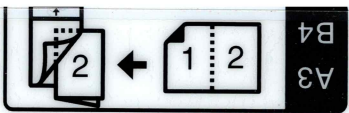
