over time.

We have been packing, sorting, ramping all  
week - and certainly have accomplished a  
world of work - one day went to our fields  
the Caucasuses - where we lovingly stored  
& sent a lot of our things - sorted, put  
aside for days etc - & had luncheon -  
one day to avoid the storm & to the knights  
the latter place collected a portion of cut glass  
- had taken brass etc a year ago - & yesterday  
day - in the case - auto fresh - CW & Co - m

- Sister & I - into a large boat & factory  
from here - (On the top of some went along  
with us in truck - quite demonstrative!)

Then went to another place - got a much  
larger - & from here I bro't little Mr.

Doralle - other name Carnum - home in  
truly car - & finally with Sister went to  
get the Caucasian load - in a smaller  
truck - then Sister didn't have to wait for the  
unloading of big large one. - The town  
it was miles & miles to go on - then

I shared for the things - a great delight  
to the boys. - In next East at several  
places I left him again - - finally
