Many thanks for your good letter. I think I understand the matter very clearly and your decision is no doubt based on right guidance and I am ready to concur with you and Mary heartily in it. I did feel and do still feel that it would be a grand thing if you could locate there in Mexico City and guide a real work in Foreign Missions.

I do not know whether the expense account amounting to \$14.96 is the entire round trip, as you state it is, or not. Were we to pay one-half and the Home Board one-half? I enclose herewith check for \$7.48 and will double this amount if we should remit.

As to the matter of freight from China, yes, write a letter to us making the request and giving us approximately some amount upon which to base an action. It at least can be considered, though after this length of time I do not know just how the matter will go.

We have heard from Mr. Leynse of North China and will secure his bonds and sell them at the earliest possible moment. He indicates that \$2,700.00 is the amount. I do not know what the bands will bring.

You will hear from us again in a few days.
