

Saunskov. Bulgaria.
June 17th 1881.

My dear parents.

Not because I was out calling last night, but because I was too tired, I did not write to you on your wedding day. Belle & I were all the evening on our bed, & so Ellen thought we must be out.

I hope you had a very pleasant wedding anniversary, & that you my dear parents, will love many more. I should like very much to have been home to spend the day with you, but perhaps I can't spend next year with you on your wedding day.

I am so anxious for a letter from home, telling me about wages & means. We often wish you would

write more about your affairs, so
that we can tell about how poor
or how comfortably off you feel.
I am now looking each mail, for
a letter from you, Father, with
some money in it.

Belle Bliss is very anxious to be
one return to Cousin with her
but I hardly think there are
any openings whatever for me
to do so, & so scarcely think
of it.

Since I began this letter I have decid-
ed not to go to Cousin, nor at least
& so am sorry I put you to the
expense of sending a telegram,
that will be of no use.

The post boy has just come,
so I cannot write more to you
now.
