July 31' 1881.

My dear Father,

Your letter dated June 28th, I received last night, & am very much obliged for the 10 £. enclosure. I have been waiting a good while for it & it was, I am sure you will know, very acceptable, It was all spent before I received it, owing to my much need. I would very much like to have more right away. I would like as much as 30 £. or 40 £. soon, if you can spend it. If I stay here another year, I want to go to Constantinople for a change, & want to pay my board, at least part of the time, for the missionaries

are too poor to keep me. As
I will not have time to hear
from you, to tell me what to
do, I'll borrow money of Miller
for my expenses in Constantine.
I hope to be off in about three
weeks. Miss Carrie Byington &
I will travel together to Couch.
Miss Carrie is a charming girl. I
wish you all knew her.

I am so glad you are getting better.
I was so worried about you Father
dear. It did seem as if I would
not wait from one mail till
the next to hear from you, or
from some one about you.

I received Mother's letter enclosing
quinn - Please thank her for it.
I am in a great hurry, as Mr
Bond is going to take Mary
& Ellen out for a ride, & I am
to go with them. Please excuse
this shabby note.
