My dear Mary:

Ellis  
Thank you so  
much for your kind  
letter received yesterday.

I had made every arrangement  
to meet & got Nazareth to  
the funeral to be held  
on Monday. But after  
that wild night of  
Sunday when I read

in the paper that the  
Geosse Central were  
not running any trains  
I gave it up as the  
trouble, confusion and  
sadness gave me I  
diarrhoea, besides I  
felt that they could  
not bring the remains  
that day.

However Edith started  
in spite of what the papers  
said about not running  
trains. She went on the  
trains. So high Valley by train.  
Leaving ~~Leavenworth~~ <sup>Leavenworth</sup> last Saturday  
only brought over night.  
There she spent over night  
and went to Nas Creek Rd  
next morning at 10 o'clock  
Tuesday. Busie and Ruth  
arrived at Nas. Mr. G. and  
Andrew Lauer came at 2:00

Bringing the body in a special trolley  
from Easton - the Beth. roads  
were not open at all. The funeral  
was held Tues. at 4 o'clock P.M.  
What a blessing that Annie knew  
nothing about it all, for no one had

eternal home although I shall miss  
her sweet kind spirit. Agnes comes home here all worn out, and
