chicken - peas - lattic potatoes

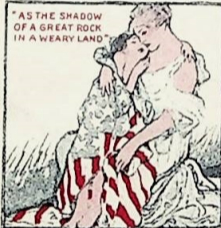
Rolls + lettuce - apples + tomatoes
