
Dear Romna:-

Your birthday letter received on the exact day and Paey's two days before. Thank you for the good wishes. I appreciate them just as much as the check. You were unable to send.



I didn't sell Daisy as Mrs. Melville didn't have the money but she wants to buy Daisy later but I doubt if she will have the money as her husband is embarking on the hardware retail business in Cereal and will probably be quite a ways in debt at the start. He will have pretty strong competition too I'm afraid. Ed Stuart offered to trade me a good work horse for Daisy and \$25 to boot and said I wouldn't need to be in any hurry about paying the "boot". This is a good horse weighing a half more than Daisy but is twelve years old. It would be a good trade but I don't think I'll take it as I don't really wish to sell except for cash and a high price at that.

We will also have 200 bushels of potatoes.

We have about \$20 now in the exchequer and still owe Shabiro \$8.40 for harvesting our grain. (He has paid him \$85.) Our dismal day comes November 1st ^{\$28.80} when we have our hail insurance note and now note \$9.00 to meet. I think Selden will start at photography again though I can ill spare him. Our crop is all cut and while not very good except one piece of oats which should yield about 100 bushels to the acre, ~~we~~ we have enough oats for this coming year's feed and about \$50 to \$100 worth of grain perhaps if we could get it threshed. Of course the threshing bill will be quite a sum and we must have some groceries built etc but the great question is whether we will be able to get threshed. There are no big farmers near us to draw the threshing machines so we will have to get threshed when we can, say after snow flies or next spring.

The train sometimes keeps us awake at night now with its tooting. We can see the smoke or train for twenty miles or more each direction. There is a little activity in ~~town~~ now - the (grain) elevators are in the air but not on the ground, several lumber yards are starting, a livery is in operation and a couple of stores and an

implement dealer or so. If all these things aren't so now they will be soon. The railroad is prospecting for a water tank and a gravel pit.

At Selden's request we have divided up our horses. I have Daisy, Lis & Bobb and Tilly and Dolly, Babes baby. Dolly is ~~the~~ apparently the poorest colt this year and has had quite a little sickness and now has goiter on her neck and is maybe blind in one eye due to running into a post. Selden has Peter, Nory, Nellie, Dorothy & Kitty. Kitty & Dorothy are both fine colts. Kitty is as big as any colt around, is in fact as big as a registered ~~Clydesdale~~ colt of Dave Stewart a month younger.

Must close. Hard freezes every night now but maybe it will warm up soon. Our first hard frost come September 15th and only one before that was August 30 which did not hurt tomato vines.



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


