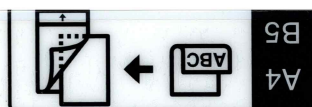
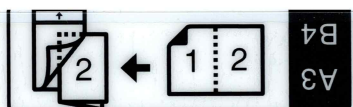


Dear Selden:-

poor pen!" That's what I say, too. I

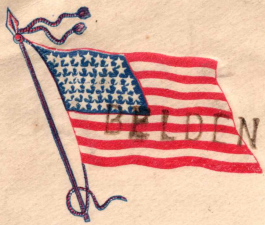


hope you can read

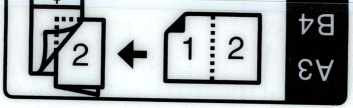

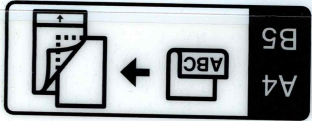
