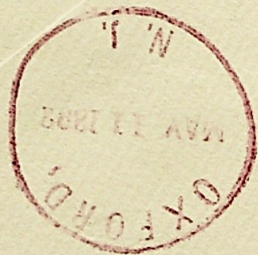

I have seen little of him since he left home when I was five years old!

I had already engaged places for

my sister and myself with Miss
Mary Balcom. I have been study-
ing steadily for twenty one months
with no rest, and though I am
not feeling tired, still I think I
had better take a fortnight or
three weeks clear rest before re-
turning to the Hospital and to
the "home stretch" of the coming
twelve months.
