at Hyoming. He announced
the first venture, that on
representative Synods in the
Reg. and the second, that
on limitation of judicial
business in the Conf.

One of the Elders is B. M. Kirk
patrick. The Churches of

Presbytery have not presen-
ted great fruits as the result
of the year's work. The number
of additions to their members-
hip have been smaller than
any year since I have been
Clerk. Kirkpatrick has
been commissioned as Presby-
terial Colporteur for another
year. The dewton folks are

works at Kingston but I fear
