


My dear Mrs. Belden,

We have your letter and are sending the material ordered for which you will find bill enclosed.

Our Board has very little new material on Africa in spite of the fact that the last has been one of the best years in our Africa mission. In fact, it has been too busy a time for the missionsries to do much writing, and the Board Secretaries have not been able to give their time to the preparation of suitable manuscript. We are sending with the other material our latest Board report and a copy of the latest bulletin. In the "Missionary Review of the "orld" for October, 1910, you will find some articles on Africa, and the last March numbers of Assembly Herald and Woman's Work will give additional information.

We are very glad indeed to know of your work, and think it a most important one, but as it is not distinctively Presbyterian, we can hardly lay claim to the report card. We would have been glad, however, to send you prayer cycles, etc. but they are entirely out of print. "Daybreak in the Dark Continent" is, as you know, several years old, but there is no more recent text-book on Africa. I should think you could supplement it by Col. Roosevelt's articles in the Outlook and other magazines, and by the latest reports from other Boards.
