Remarks

Your Committee in looking back over their work, are deeply impressed with a sense of "human frailty," and are conscious of errors "both of omission and commission," but notwithstanding that, they are enabled ^{to report} a gain in several important respects first the enlargement has added to the number of sittings about thirty per cent (nearly one third larger). 2^d An average assessment of twelve and ⁵⁹/₁₀₀ dollars upon each ~~seat~~ ^{piece}, will now give about the same amount, as formerly realised upon an assessment of sixteen dollars, thus enabling you to give the pious holder better accommodations for less money. 3^d The addition of thirteen feet, with the relief of the gallery gives the audience room of the Church its proper proportion, which so pleasingly strikes the eye on entering a well proportioned room. 4th The enlarged basement, with flue, makes it easy, at any time to put in heating apparatus.
