The results from those at work are to be found in the awakening of many from the sleep of Romanism and of indifference. Owing to Deculiar social conditions the number of secret believers ~~is~~ is large. We are constantly meeting those who accept Christianity but who do not come out fully for the Master because the wife or daughters would so greatly oppose. Then the vast number of relatives keep from honest expression. This trouble can only be overcome when there is sufficient public opinion to make it less difficult to break away from the old past.

Our main work now is to sow the seed, to form opinion, to follow up influences till by and by the end we seek will be reached. We have government on our side. The Catholic Church is constantly losing its hold on the affections of the people. Yet this hold is still strong and the process of loosening the grip exceedingly slow.

There must be patience in looking for fruits. He who ~~now~~ looks at Chile today and compares it with Chile of twenty years ago will find that the change in public sentiment is most astonishing. By the tippie line of schools, the press, and preaching we will surely win in the struggle with error and superstition.
